Sugar Maple

SCIENTIFIC NAME: Acer saccharum

FAMILY: Sapindaceae

ORIGION: Eastern Canada and Eastern US

The scientific name for the Sugar maple is Acer saccharum. It is a species of flowering plant in the soapberry and lychee family

Sapindaceae. It is native to the hardwood forests of eastern Canada and eastern United States.

You'll find Sugar Maple trees throughout Springboro Tree Farms. The Sugar Maple is best known for being the primary source of maple syrup and for its brightly colored fall foliage.

We tap about 400 maple trees annually in the early spring. The sap yield from those trees is typically 3500+ gallons of sap at 1.5% to 2% sugar. That boils down to about 50-60 gallons of Springboro Tree Farms delicious small-batch wood-fired maple syrup.
